

MESSAGE FROM THE HEAD

So, the first thing I need to share with you this week, is just how amazing your children are! I am sure you already know that but I have been so very impressed with how they have returned. We, as adults, may have found the lockdown period trying but at least we understand the reasons for this; the children on the other hand, have spent time away from friends, have not been able to play outside and have not had the daily routines they have from going to school, but the adaptability and resilience that they are showing is fantastic. I have walked around school and seen children engaging with their teachers, supporting each other and taking pride in what they are doing. I have seen the youngest children playing and making new friendships, heard Year 2 children talking about digraphs and trigraphs in a phonics lesson and seen some beautiful cursive handwriting in Year 1. The older children are showing respect for each other and for the learning opportunities and have engaged well with our Here We Are topic. I really couldn't be more pleased with how they have returned and I know this is, in no small part, down to the positive messages that your are giving them at home and the reinforcement by staff in school.



Of course, the one thing that children love to do is share and that is not always a good thing when it comes to germs! We have a large number of children who have started the term with a cold which is totally understandable and I really feel for them..and for you... as we are all hyper vigilant of coughs and sniffles right now.

This is the term when the bugs appear and I understand that it could be really difficult to make the decision as to whether it is ok to send your child to school or not. Last week I sent out a flow chart of what would happen if your child displayed symptoms in school, this week I am sending information on what to do with different symptoms that may present themselves (please see separate attachment). Hopefully this will help to make things clearer as to the steps you need to take if your child has symptoms of coronavirus through to those of a common cold. We, of course, do not want to elevate any risk for the children and I can assure you we are also being vigilant in school, but with guidance that we have I think we could all do with some consistency to get us through the coming weeks and months.
