MESSAGE FROM THE DEPUTY HEAD

My biggest and most important role here at Maple Tree is making sure that every child is happy and safe, both at school and at home; this responsibility is called safeguarding. This responsibility extends to keeping the children safe online, which is quite the challenge in the modern day when the apps and websites seem to change overnight!

Over the Summer we have been working hard to update our Online Safety Policy, which covers how we educate the pupils about staying safe online, how the internet is used at school on different devices and what we expect from the children in terms of what is acceptable online behaviour and what is not. The policy is currently in draft form and has been sent out with this newsletter. The pupils and staff have both been able to offer feedback on this policy and now we would like to offer parents the same opportunity for input, which you can do by emailing in to office@mapletreeprimaryschool.com.

A website that I would like to raise awareness of is called Omegle, which is a chatroom for over 18s that some of our children have mentioned. Everyone a Leader... Everyone a Learner

With the start of the new school year we turn our attention to the priorities we have which were shared with you at the start of the term. This year we aim to strengthen our community and use opportunities for collaborative working under the mantle of 'everyone a leader, everyone a learner'



This week we demonstrate how our learning community is made up:

Governors as learners. The role of a governor is to support with the strategic planning of the school whilst at the same time holding school to account. In order to be able to do that effectively, governors need to have a solid understanding of the curriculum and its expectations. With many governors working within roles outside of education, they take on learning opportunities to ensure their own knowledge and understanding develops in order to be able to ask pertinent questions.

Teachers as learners. The curriculum is very much a focus for us this year and we will be using our staff training to develop the skills, knowledge and understanding that the children need to build on here at Maple Tree. As the adage goes 'everyday's a school day' and no matter what our role is within school, we all face daily learning opportunities. It is this that enables us to keep our knowledge and skills up to date which, in turn, allows us to support and teach the children whilst modelling resilience and teaching them strategies to help with attainment and progress.

Our aim is to support you in a variety of ways this year to help you to help your children. There will be more information on this as we move through the school year.

Children as learners. This we know without doubt and we will be ensuring that we share curriculum information with you so that you can see how and what the children are learning this year along with the progress they are making.

Parents' and Carers' Survey July 2021

Thank you to everyone who took part in our end of year parent survey in July. It has been really useful to gain an insight into what is working well and what needs to be adapted and there are certainly some things to celebrate!

The survey was in two sections, there was a series of multiple choice questions and then we asked three further questions:

In your opinion, what are the best things about Maple Tree?

Is there anything particular you would change about the school?

In what ways would you like to see the school develop over the next three to five years?

As there has been a lot of response to these questions, we are currently working our way through these so therefore, today, we are sharing the results of section one—the multiple choice results - and in the next couple of weeks we will share with you the other answers along with our responses.

We will be following up the large percentage of parents who disagree that bullying is dealt with effectively to ensure that communication between school and home is strong. Bullying will be on our agenda for discussion at Parent Forum meetings this year.

We will also be sharing information with you during the course of this year to reach the number of families who do not know about the measures we take to promote an Anti-Bullying message, and the tangible and effective activities and strategies in place to ensure that the children understand how important it is to be kind and caring, and what to do if there is any sign of bullying. We will be embarking on a series of activities during 2021-2022 to ensure that parents of our younger/newer children know how well we address Anti-Bullying and PSHE (Personal, Social, Health Education).

We will be increasing the amount of information we are providing our parents of SEND children so they are aware of the support their children are receiving. If we can reach the 44% of families who do not know if the support given will help their children to succeed, then potentially 89% of our SEND families would be happy with the provision we provide. Omegle is a website that pairs random strangers for live text or video chats. It first launched in 2009 and its slogan is "Talk to strangers!" There is an option for adult (18+) content and a section for people aged 13+ with parental permission. Anyone can use the site. Users simply go to Omegle.com and then choose 'Text' or 'Video' chat and the page states how many users are currently online. Depending on the time of day this can be hundreds of thousands. Omegle markets itself as a great way to meet new friends however has been known to feature pornography and inappropriate content within chats, so it's important parents are aware of the risks associated with the site.
