

MESSAGE FROM THE HEAD

Welcome to our first newsletter of the new school year! Whether you are a current parent, or a new parent, I hope that you will find the information here useful as it is my intention to keep you up to date with things happening in and around school. Learning to Learn

As a headteacher, the most important thing to me is teaching, learning and ensuring the children are making progress. I am passionate about what goes on both in the classrooms and on the playground and as such it has been so lovely to welcome the children back to the new year and to meet our new youngest pupils. I have spent time in all classes this week and have been so impressed with how quickly they have settled into new routines and are already showing high levels of engagement in their learning. Well done to the children and to the staff who are creating some amazing learning opportunities for the children. I have included some of my highlights below:

Year 6 - High levels of motivation and engagement in Year 6 during maths and English lessons and a rapidly growing curiosity for their new learning.

Year 5 - Some fantastic writing already with pupils showing a great mindset, they are happy to share their work aloud and take supportive comments to enable them to improve; a very mature attitude.

Year 4 - It has been lovely to visit the Year 4 on different occasions this week and to see the children considering their aspirations for the year - they could articulate the reasons for their choices and made realistic but challenging targets for themselves. I also saw some fantastic feats of dexterity as they began to make self-portraits in the style of a Roman mosaic - lots of patience as well!

Year 3 - High levels of enjoyment and engagement in a maths lesson as the children created objects out of base 10 and then calculated what the object equaled overall - lots of great addition strategies going on here!

Year 2 - It has been great to see the children getting straight into the cutting and sticking but also showing how fabulously they can clear up afterwards. Really taking responsibility for their own space within the classroom.

Year 1 - Watching the children show really positive attitudes towards their learning and showing a sense of independence already.

Reception - The children have settled so well and were completely engaged in a variety of bright activities, learning skills that will help them independently in their learning - a great start!

Mulberries - Watching our youngest children adapt quickly to being with others and seeing them sharing without asking - fab!

PE - All classes have been thoroughly enjoying outdoor PE lessons with Miss Milne this week. It is good to see the children coming to school in their PE kits as this saves precious time in lessons and cuts down on the amount of lost property. Levels of motivation and active participation in this important curriculum area have been amazing.

There will be more to share in the coming weeks. Have a lovely weekend.

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Uniform

It has been wonderful seeing the children return looking smart wearing their Maple Tree uniforms with pride. We encourage all children to wear uniform at Maple Tree, as we believe that it creates a sense of belonging and identity for the children.

All the children are expected to wear navy trousers, shorts or skirts with a royal blue knitted jumper or cardigan. In Mulberries only, we also accept navy joggers or leggings. From Reception to Year 2 the children wear white polo shirts under their jumpers whereas from year 3 up the children wear white shirts with a clip on tie. Across the school, yellow or blue checked summer dresses are allowed in the warm weather. All children should be wearing smart black school shoes: no heels, trainers or strappy sandals allowed. Velcro fastenings are much appreciated in the younger years where pupils can't yet tie their own laces.

Our PE kit consists of: a yellow t-shirt, navy shorts, plain navy/black jumper and joggers and trainers for

outdoor activities. Following feedback from staff, parents and children, we decided that children should come to school in their PE kit on the day that they have PE or a PE club, as this maximises the learning time and decreases the amount of lost uniform.

At the parent forum last year, these uniform expectations were discussed and I wanted to make you aware of our new procedures that staff will follow if the children are not in correct uniform. In the first instance, teachers will have an informal conversation with the parents on pick up/drop off (or phone call) to discuss expectations. Personal circumstances are considered and there is support from the school available, if needed. After this, teachers will send home a pre-written letter, outlining the correct uniform procedure from their key stage leader.
