Finally, I wanted to share with you some of our wonderful classroom displays. I hope you have a great weekend.














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This week in Fir Class

Expressive Art and Design

We have been doing lots of junk modelling this week! We have been exploring different methods and resources to join pieces together. We made a class robot and the children have had lots of fun making their own robots. There are even a couple of our class made robots decorating our class-room.





Maths

We have been exploring measures all this week. We have learned the words *mass* and *capacity*. The children have filled the water tray up outside using different sized containers, and we discussed how we could fill it up quickest. We have also explored balancing the bucket scales with objects, then numicon numbers.

Literacy

We are continuing learning our level 3 phonics, and this week we have learned the digraphs sh, th(unvoiced), th (voiced) and ng. The children have done lots of practice writing words, captions and short sentences. Well done!

ABC


We listened to ABC by the Jackson 5 and discussed what we liked about it, or not.


MARVELLOUS

Following feedback that parents are no longer getting notifications when new marvellous me activities, badges or messages are sent, Miss Hyde met with the support team to try and figure out why. They have sent over the following information:

Parents need to ensure their device is set to receive MarvellousMe notifications, so they are alerted when a new message is sent to them/for their child. They also have the option to set email alerts.

- Open the Parent app.
- Select Settings.
- Ensure the Get device notifications option is switched to ON (If it is already showing as ON, switch OFF, then back to ON)
- Optional: Switch the Get email alerts to ON.







We also recommend that parents visit their device Settings for the 'MarvellousMe for Parents' app and check their notifications will be displayed on their Lock Screen and with the Banner Style as 'Persistent'. This will help to ensure they don't miss new notifications coming through.

In android phones, you can ensure notifications are turned on by going to settings, notifications, app notifications and ensure that it is toggled on for marvellous me.

What Parents & Carers Need to Know about

ROBLOX

Roblox is one of the most popular video games on the market. By 2020, the game's makers were claiming that more than half of children in the USA play it. As a 'sandbox' title, Roblox offers a huge amount of creative freedom: it lets players create their own gaming experiences with the Roblox Studio to build custom levels and games, which can then be shared with other players online. Roblox fosters creative thinking and enjoys a robust online community of fans.

CONTACT WITH STRANGERS

Robiox encourages players to communicate online (including a group chat facility). This could expose children to risks such as scammers, online predators, harassment, griefers and more. The in-game chat has some filters, but isn't perfect players can still send harmful messages to others - such as general hostility - while predators can reach out to children directly.

PUBLIC SERVERS

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

Robiox has private or VIP servers which allow people to play exclusively with their friends, but this costs money. Most Robiox players will instead be on public servers that anyone can join. Servers can host games which focus on all kinds of aspects, including direct player interaction. Some games and servers, therefore, will put children more at risk of contact from strangers than others.

ONLINE DATERS

These are also called 'Opers' and are quite common in Roblax. An Oper is an individual who joins a game with the intention of finding someone to date online – and eventually meet in person. Suct online dating is against the Roblax community guidelines, but this usually doesn't deter Opers. Some player-built Roblax game worlds have even been designed with online dating specifically in mind.

IN-APP PURCHASES

Roblicx is actually free to download and play, but bear in mind that there are some hidden costs. Players are encouraged to make purchases in the game, for example, using real money, People can also buy extra Robus (the in-game currency) to spend on cosmetic items in the game, and some private or VIP servers also have a cost.

Advice for Parents & Carers

SET PARENTAL CONTROLS

Roblax comes with several parental control options, which are explained well on the game's official website. It's essential to enter the correct date of birth for your child, as that allows Roblox to automatically apply the appropriate chat filters. The game also allows parents and caters to set monthly spending

DISABLE PRIVATE MESSAGING

Robiox's private messaging function raises the risk of children being contacted by people they may not want to speak with - potentially leading to bullying, harassment, toxicity and scam attempts. The game allows you to disable messages from anyone who hasn't been added

PRINATE SERVERS

If your child has genuine thends who they play Roblox online with, poying for a private or VIP server decreases the risk of contact from strangers. Even then, however, some players could invite other people – who might not necessarily be child friendly – into the private server. If your child is a Roblax fan, it is important to talk with them requiatly about who they are playing the game with.

MONITOR SPENDING

If they don't understand they're using real money, it's easy for children to accidentally spend a sizeable amount in the game. Using parental controls to place limits on their spending will help avoid any nasty financial surprises. Ensuring that you have two-factor authentication on your payment accounts also makes harder for your child to spend money inadvertently.

DEALING WITH STRANGERS

At some point in their development, your child will need to learn how to deal with strangers online. Show them how to block and report any users who are upsetting them or osking uncomfortable questions. Talking to them about what's OK to discuss — and what they should never tell a stranger anilne — will help them understand how to communicate with others safely in the diable world.







